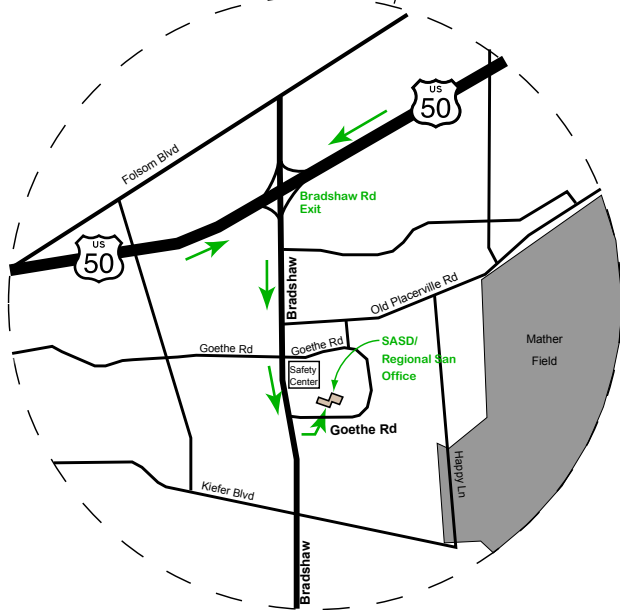
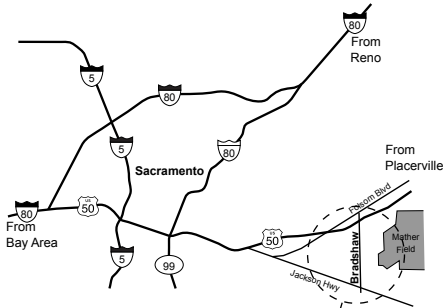

Message from the Conference Chair

Our goals for this year's conference are: to prepare you for important new regulations and policies that will impact your wastewater utility; to demonstrate how, through CVCWA, we can work together to effect reasonable, science-based regulations to address important environmental issues; and to facilitate active discussion among our members about these and other important issues.
